hearing.

After the two-hour interview Mr. Mendell leaves the interview room, the video camera remains running and, of course, the audio portion of it, too. You can hear a conversation in the hallway outside the interview room on the microphone of the camera which is shooting an empty room.

Detective McColgin, that's M-C-C-O-L-G-I-N, introduces himself to Mr. Mendell, or is introduced to Mr. Mendell. Detective McColgin can be heard asking "do you know Nathan"?

And Mr. Mendell says, "yes, vaguely".

The detective says "would you recognize the person as Nathan"?

And Mr. Mendell is heard saying "the problem is I haven't seen Nathan", and his voice trails off, in other words, he is still talking, but I could not make out the words despite turning the volume up full blast, so I don't know what the rest of that sentence was.

And Detective McColgin is heard saying that "she", referring to Sam Rhoads, "positively identified Nathan". She said, "hey, man, that's him" She positively identified him.

At some point after this, apparently, it is my understanding of the chronology, the form says at 5:01 P.M. Mr. Mendell was shown a photo spread, he was given the admonishment form with the usual

language relating to a photo lineup admonishment and he viewed the photo spread that is closest of the three, which it's a clear color copy of a photo array. He picked photo Number 2, which is.

Mr. Medina's photo.

And the form on the front quotes

Mr. Mendell as saying "I think it was number 2 that

tried to kill me".

And the photo of the defendant in the photo spread is the same presumably arrest photo that the sheriff's department or the sheriff's deputies had pulled up on their laptop and shown Mr. Medina on the scene, so he was essentially identifying the same photo he identified a few hours earlier in the the single photo display.

Mr. Mendell did identify the defendant's photo as the person responsible for holding a gun to his head.

He testified at the preliminary hearing that he was not 100-percent positive at the time of the photo spread, but he -- but that the defendant -- the defendant's photograph looked most like the shooter.

At the preliminary hearing on March 30th, 2008, Mr. Mendell was asked to and with permission of the Court and counsel got off the witness stand, walked up to the defendant, had the defendant stand up, they stood face to face approximately ten feet
